

## *Biography*

Dr. David Jolly, Associate Professor in the Department of Public Health Education at North Carolina Central University (NCCU), has a long list of accomplishments working as a public health educator and social justice advocate. He received the DrPH in Health Behavior and Health Education (UNC-CH); MSPH in Health Administration (UNC-CH); M.Ed. in Elementary Education (Tufts) and B.A. in Sociology (Princeton). He has been employed as a counselor, elementary school teacher, AIDS educator, consultant, program manager, faculty member and department chair.

Dr. Jolly is the author of numerous book chapters and peer-reviewed articles and has presented at local, state, and national conferences. He has been the lead or co-principal investigator on seven external grants including a 5-year grant to evaluate systematic partnership-building approaches for HIV prevention with Dr. Kate McQueen (fhi360) and a study led by Dr. Laura Linnan (UNC-Chapel Hill) to develop a theory-informed, community-based participatory research approach to promoting physical activity among Black men through barbershops. Dr. Jolly has successfully managed the Partners Fellows program with Dr. Sandra White (NCCU-Biology) to increase the number of undergraduates who successfully pursue careers in cancer research. Other grant activities include the exploration of masculine gender constructs and its relationship to HIV/AIDS risk behaviors; campaigns to combat tobacco use; and strategies for reaching men of color who have sex with other men for HIV prevention, testing, and care. In all of his research projects Dr. Jolly has included funding to hire students as research assistants and entry-level health educators.

Additionally, Dr. Jolly has served as the Faculty Advisor for COLORS (NCCU's LGBT student organization) and the Co-Founder/Faculty Advisor for Project SAFE (NCCU's HIV/STD peer education program). Outside of NCCU, he serves on the Board of Directors for Youth Empowered Solutions (YES) and is an active member of the Access to Health Care Committee, Partnership for Healthy Durham. Past community service included work with the Durham County Resource Investment Cabinet, United Way of the Greater Triangle, and the Board of Directors for the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Orange.
